
Making your Will

When instructing your solicitor it is important to name Downe House as the beneficiary and to quote our Registered Charity Number 1015059.

- A Specific Bequest can be a fixed sum or a percentage of your residual estate.
- A Reversionary Legacy passes to Downe House after the death of any dependents.
- A Conditional Legacy names Downe House as the beneficiary should your heirs not survive you.

We strongly recommend that you engage a solicitor to draw up your Will and that you seek the advice of a solicitor to discuss your personal circumstances.

The Palmer Society is named after Elizabeth Palmer, a great benefactor of the School who was closely associated with it all her life. She joined the School as a pupil in 1920, and then returned firstly as a member of the office staff and later as Miss Medley's first Vice-Principal. Following her retirement, Elizabeth continued to open her doors at Fencewood House to members of staff both for regular, convivial dinners and also for staff accommodation. On her death in 1998 she left the house to the School.
