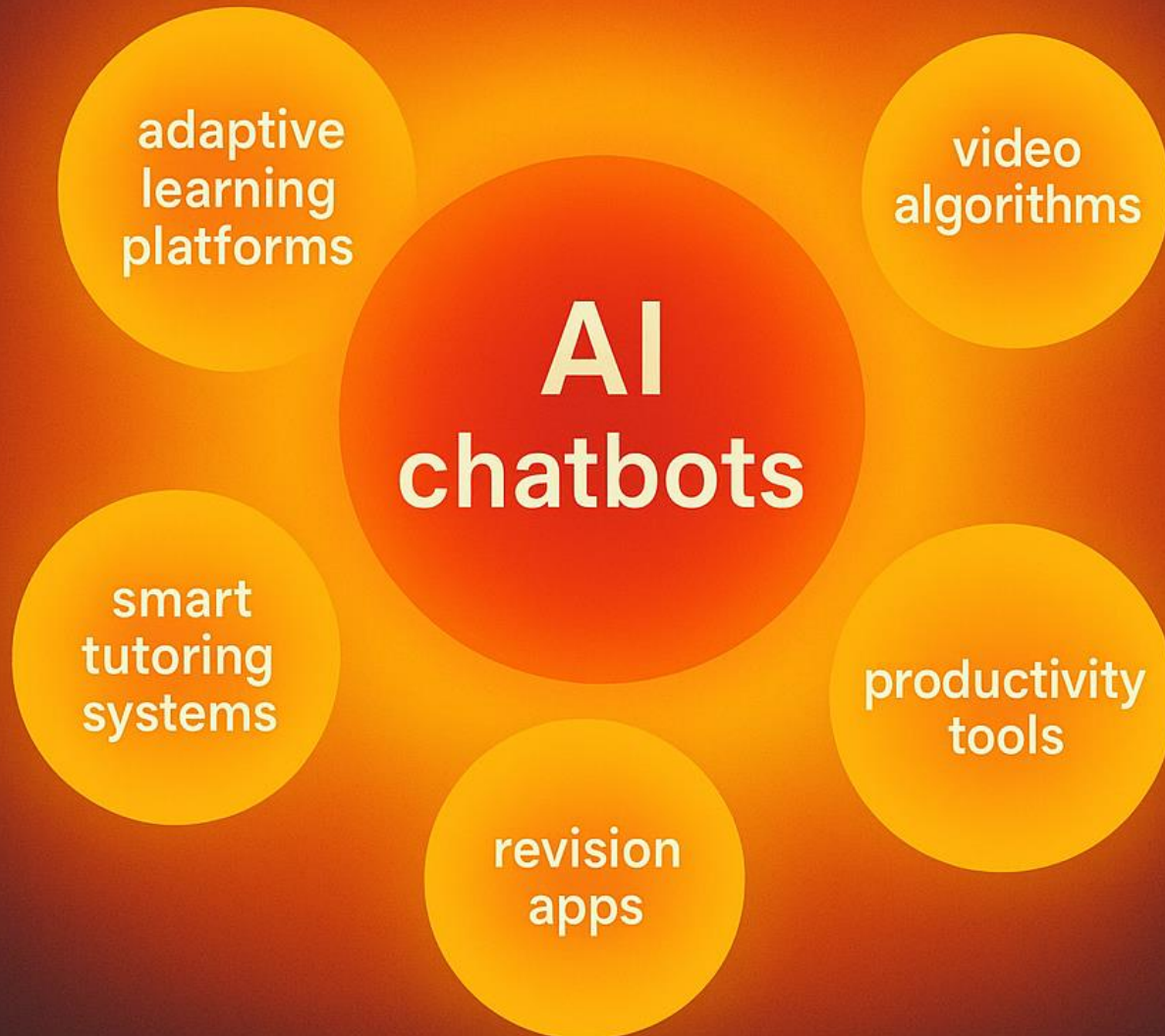

60% say AI improves their learning experience

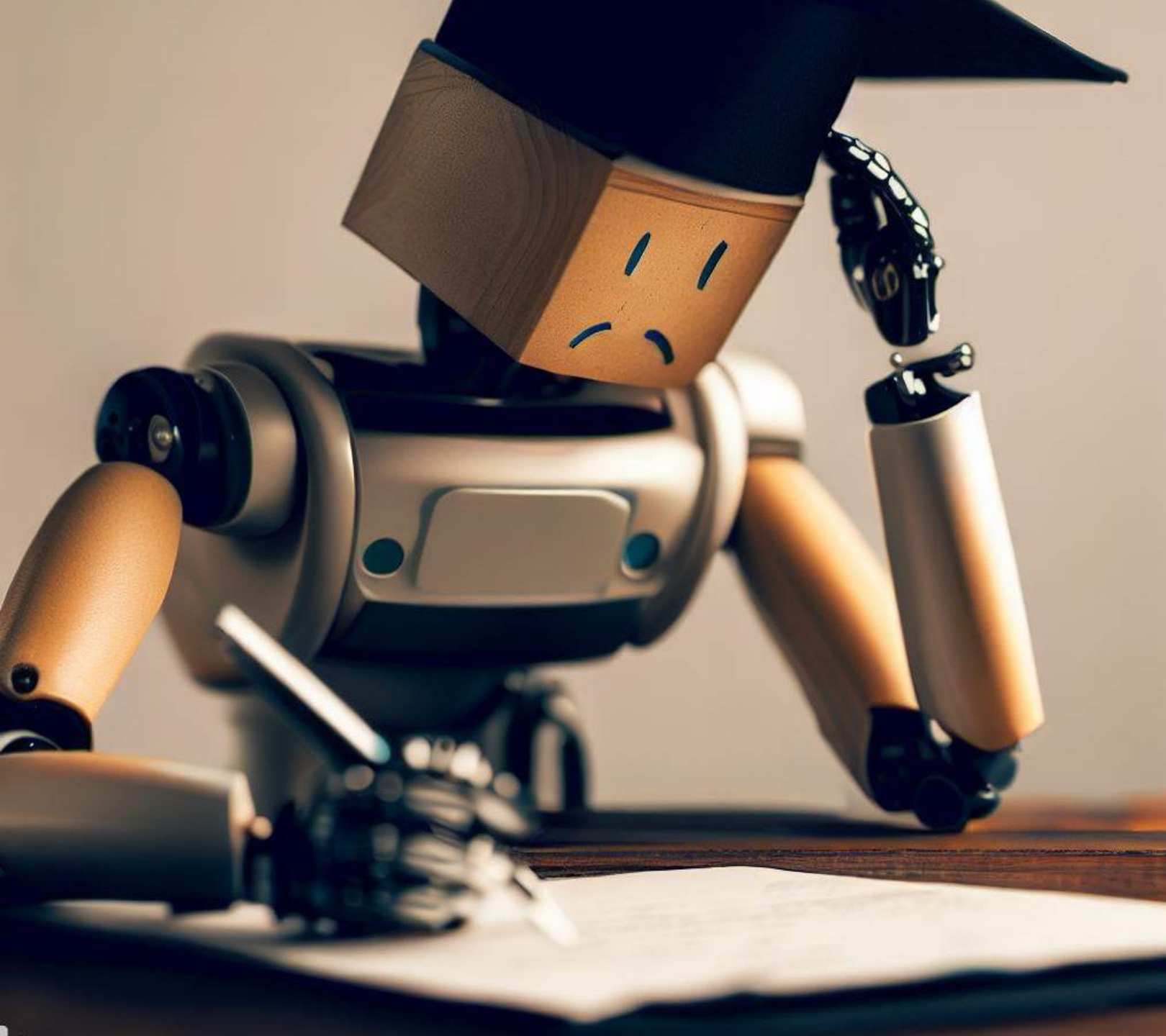
35% believe AI will be essential to their future careers

# AI User Scale: Artificial Intelligence vs Your Intelligence

This scale is designed to guide you in understanding appropriate and responsible use of AI when completing your written assignments.

	AI vs You	Examples	How to Reference
<b>No AI</b>  AI – 0% You -100%	The Assignment is completed <b>entirely on your own</b> . Using traditional methods without any AI. You may look up a word in the dictionary or an online dictionary, but <b>no AI</b> is used.	You may use Collins online dictionary, or Word Reference to look up a word.	No reference needed
<b>Limited AI Use</b>  AI - <10% You - >90%	You do all the <b>thinking</b> , and the writing and AI may check your spelling and your grammar.  You ask AI to explain the question to you if you do not understand it.	You use a tool like Grammarly or Word Review to check your spelling and your grammar.  You put the question into ChatGPT to seek clarification of its meaning.	Brief Statement noting use of AI. eg.: "Spell Check & Grammar Suggestions provided by Word or Grammarly  AI explained the question.
<b>Moderate AI Support</b>  AI - <40 You – 60%	You do all the initial thinking and creating, but you ask AI to be your critical friend and cast an eye over content and provide further suggestions for improvement and enhancement.	You use AI to read through your essay and provide some further suggestions. You then think about these suggestions and if appropriate add these, in your own words to your essay.	Further ideas and suggestions ( <b>highlight these additions in your work</b> ) from: OpenAI(2024) ChatGPT (Mar 14 version) <a href="https://chat.openai.com/chat">https://chat.openai.com/chat</a>  Provide prompt given to the AI
<b>Significant AI Support</b>  AI - >70% You - <30%	AI provides the basis on which you build and complete your work. For example, it provides the plan and the ideas, but you complete the task. <b>AI does most of the thinking</b> .	You submit the question to AI (ChatGPT) and it provides the plan, the themes and ideas. You then go back to your notes and write the essay based on this support.	Ideas and Suggestions ( <b>highlight these in your work</b> ) from: OpenAI(2024) ChatGPT (Mar 14 version) <a href="https://chat.openai.com/chat">https://chat.openai.com/chat</a>  Provide prompt given to the AI and AI output
<b>Complete AI</b>  AI – 100% You – 0%	<b>AI does all the thinking</b> . It comes up with the idea and completes the task for you.		AI completed this task.

# Practical Strategies for School Leaders

## Action:

Values driven vision → Aligns policy and strategy avoiding mixed messages

Audit current usage by staff & students → Reveal hidden practice, informs policy, reveals your AI champions

Create a staff AI Team → Shared ownership, spread expertise, reach a wider audience

Provide CPD → Foster innovation, demonstrate responsible use, outline issues

# Practical Strategies for School Leaders

## Action:

Involve your students → Build trust & digital maturity

Pilot/Review AI tools → Model best practice, keep the focus on purpose over product.

Review AI Policies → Are they fit for purpose?

Continued CPD → Increased confidence, greater purposeful use.
